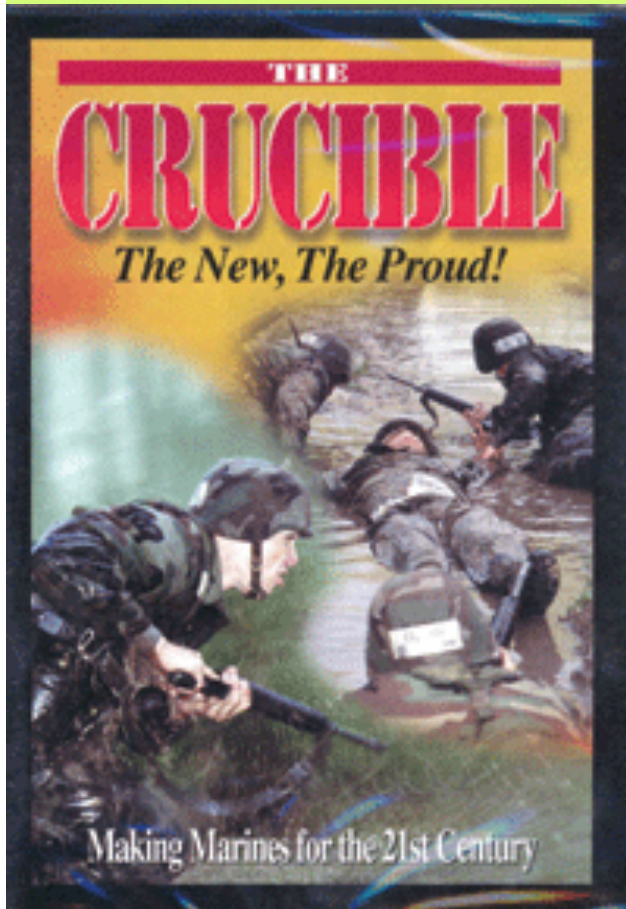

“What comes next is very important: I am sending what my Father promised to you, so stay here in the city until he arrives, until you’re equipped with POWER FROM ON HIGH”

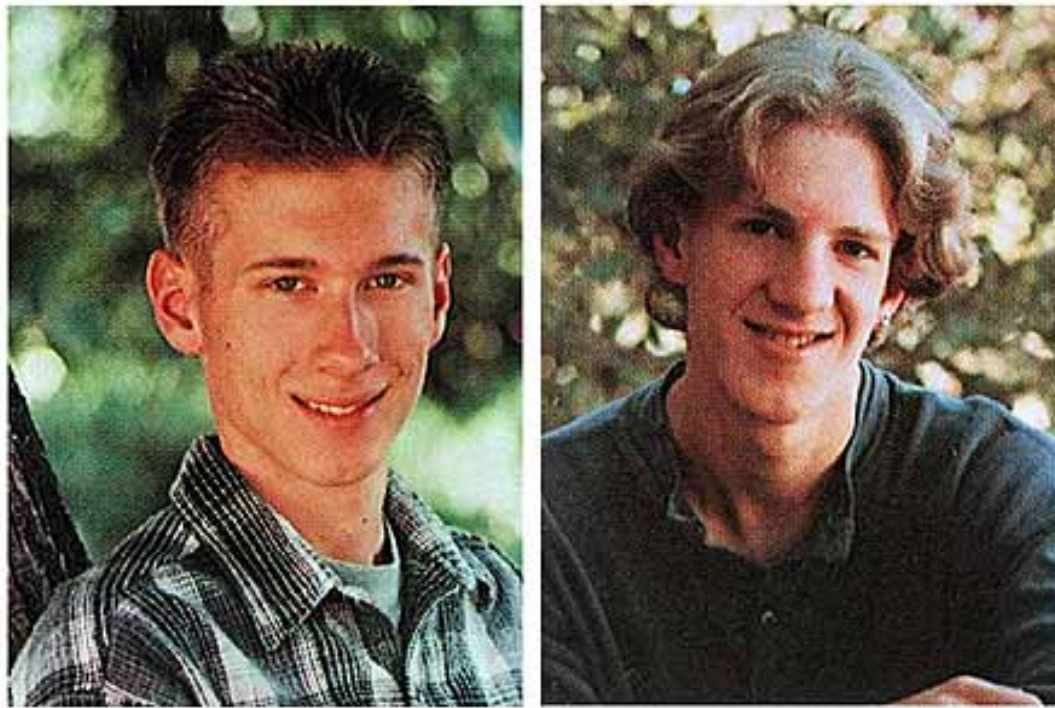

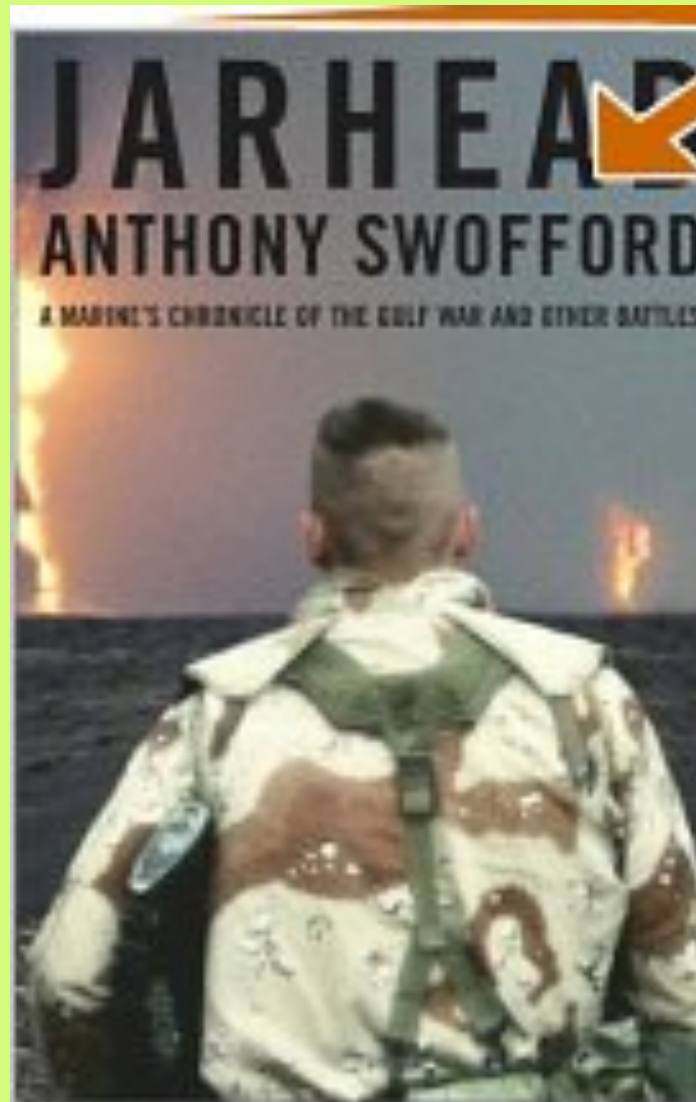

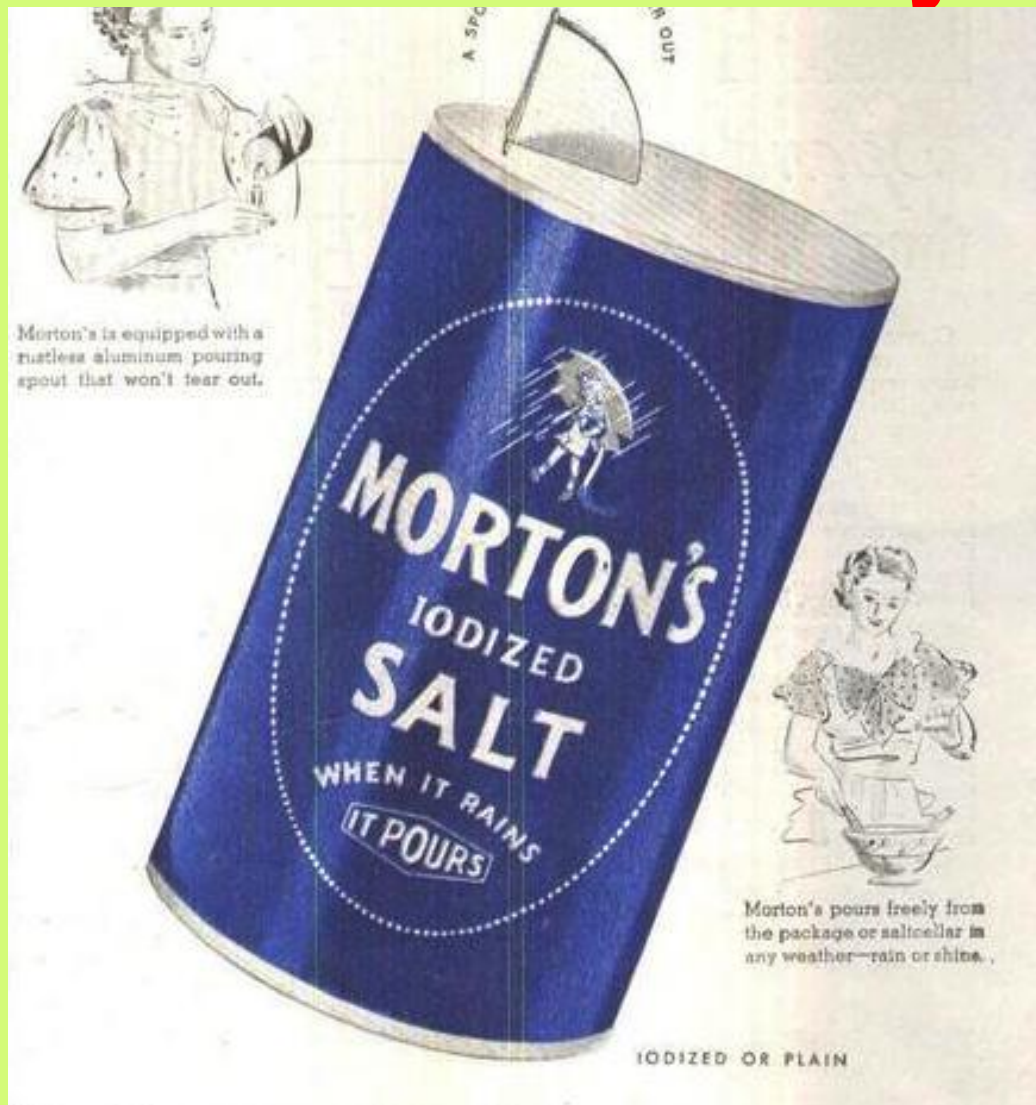


George McClellan Civil War Military Leader?

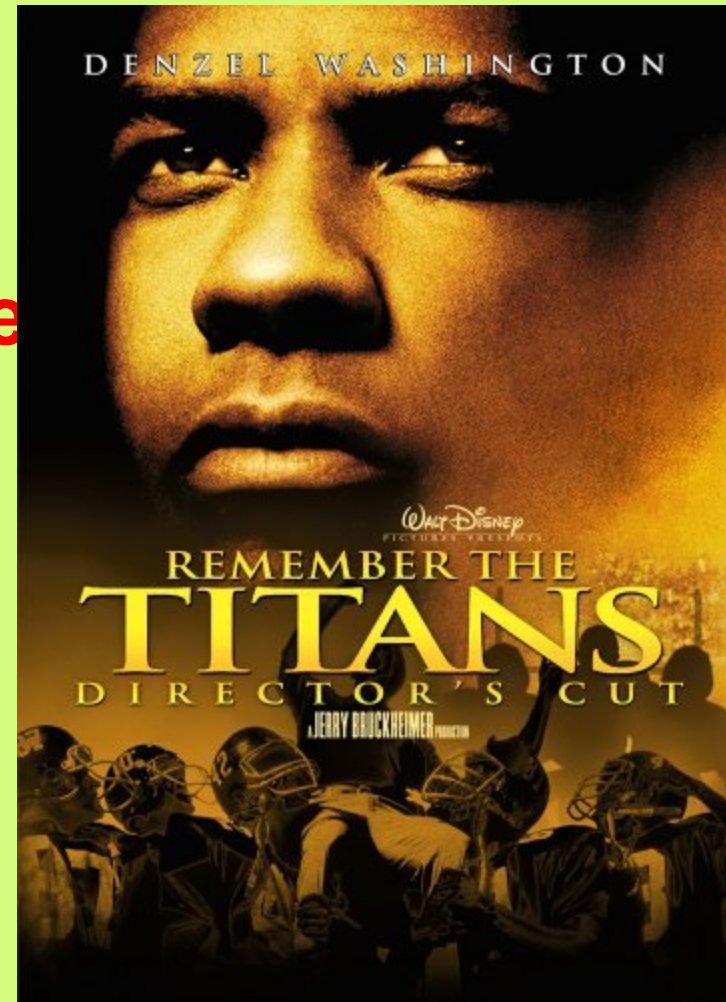
